Here's what's happening in Stewiacke ...

Council and Staff

- The Engineering, Sustainable Growth Community Development & Resiliency Plan has been approved by town council and awarded to CBCL. We are dedicated to bringing a fresh and exciting vision going forward for our town. The public engagement process will start in December.

Finances

- The starting phase of the upcoming budget will proceed in January.

Infrastructure

- Currently an Asset Management review is being completed by a Dalhousie University student Emily Gowan.

Commercial Development

- Deputy Mayor Chapman and I attended the official opening October 7th of the Great Canadian Dollar Store on behalf of town council. Town Council wishes the owner Kevin Kane and staff success in the downtown core.

What I've Been up to

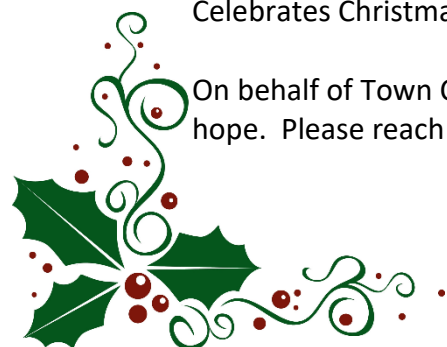

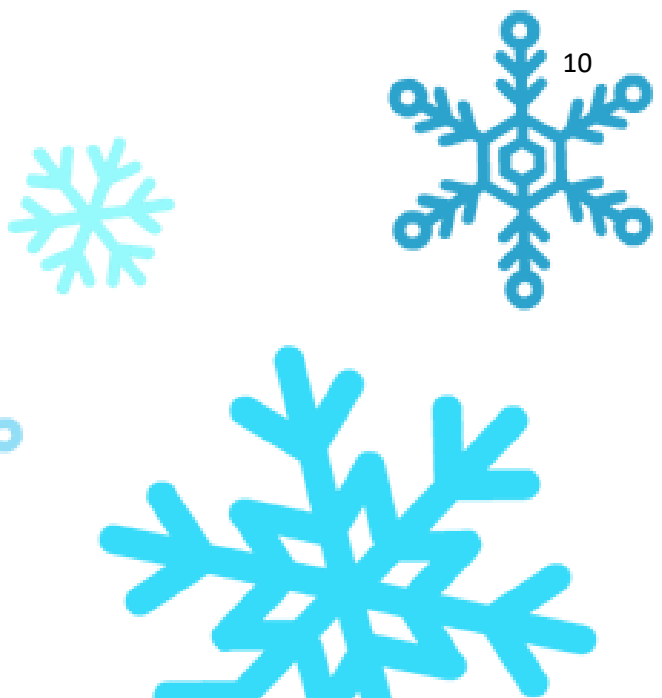

WINTER PARKING BAN

Temporary Traffic Regulations

- (a) Between the 15th day of December, 2022 and the 15th day of April 2023, inclusive, no owner or driver or person having control of custody of any vehicle shall park or leave standing the same upon any street in the Town of Stewiacke, between the hour of one o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the morning of the same day.
- (b) No owner or driver of any vehicle shall, between the 15th day of December 2022 and the 15th day of April 2023 inclusive, park or leave the same standing or unattended-ed by a person authorized to move or capable of operating the same upon any street in the Town of Stewiacke such a manner as to hinder, inconvenience, or prevent the proper removal of snow and ice from such a street

It shall be an offence for any person to fail to comply with these regulations and any such person will be liable to a penalty as provided by Section 292 of the Motor Vehicle Act



Current Snow and Ice Control Practices

The Superintendent of Public Works is responsible for the coordination and deployment of resources as it relates to snow and ice control within the boundaries of the Town of Stewiacke.

For the purposes of snow and ice control Public Works staff have established 4 priority areas as follows:

Priority 1- Major Collector Streets: Kitchener Street, Main Street East, Main Street West to the end of the pavement (Low Tide Rd), George Street and access to the Fire Hall bay doors

Priority 2- Minor Collector Street: St Andrews Street

Priority 3- Remaining Local Streets

Priority 4- Town owned parking areas/lots

The level of snow and ice control will depend on the snow event. For a snow event that is forecasted to deposit a maximum of three (3) inches or less, crews will utilize the deployment of salt. For snow events forecasted to deposit more than three (3) inches, a combination of plowing and salt will be utilized to ensure streets and sidewalks are passable for vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

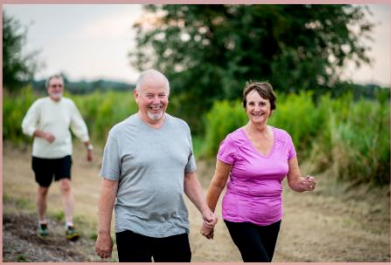

Pine Grove Cemetery

Things were looking good with the trees, shrubs and the overall look of the Cemetery. We have continued to top up graves, lifted and cement headstones to their bases, and lined things up. Next Fiona arrived and only did minor damage such as 2 tree tops broke off, a large pine in the back down, and there were several big branches down. Fiona also lifted 2 small trees roots up so they will need dealing with. There were 8 headstones fell off there base and will be raised in the spring as the setting compound will not set at this time of year. We will place some boards under them to keep them off the grass.

Mentorship Program

Are you interested in passing on a certain skill you have obtained throughout your life? Is it wood carving, knitting, cooking, playing cards/chess, outdoor survival skills, playing music or anything else you have an interest in? We are looking for you! The Town of Stewiacke is hoping to find at least 10 individuals adults/seniors who have a skill or passion they would like to share with a youth from our community. The ask from you for this program is 2 hours on the 3rd Sunday of each month, you would meet your partner at the community center and start skill sharing.

There is an application process to become a mentor

- Description of what your skill/passion is
- If you would need any support to be able to offer this to your partner
- Vulnerable Sector Check completion
- Basic information collection

Are you a youth (8 YR plus) in Stewiacke looking to connect with someone who has years of knowledge in a certain area that interests you? The commitment is to meet for 2 hours on the 3rd Sunday of each month. You may also have something you are passionate about and are wanting to share with your partner and that is absolutely encouraged!

There is an application process for youth

- Selecting a partner based on their skill/passion
- Registration form
- Waiver/consent form completion from your guardian.

These monthly meets are supervised by Town of Stewiacke staff and are held within town owned property/facilities. The first monthly meet is on Sunday December 18th from 1:00pm-3:00pm. These meets will run until Summer 2023, or until you and your partner have shared all learnings with each other.

Deadline to apply for this program for both mentor and mentee is December 9th. Once the deadline has been met Erin will match youth and adult/seniors. If you've been given a match Erin will let you know. If you have not been matched, we will continue looking for a partner.
